New ferries take to the harbour


Five of the six new Inner Harbour Ferries are now in Sydney. Following a customer competition, these vessels were named the Catherine Hamlin, the Fred Hollows, the Victor Chang and the Pemulwuy.

The name of the fifth vessel will be announced shortly. The sixth vessel is nearing completion and expected in Sydney for trials soon..

All new ferries look similar to the yellow and green First Fleet boats but have improved access for less mobile customers.

New Intercity Fleet

The NSW Government is delivering a New Intercity Fleet to replace trains currently carrying customers from Sydney to the Central Coast, Newcastle, the Blue Mountains and the South Coast.

The new double deck trains will provide:

- · Wider seats with arm rests and more space
- Charging stations for mobile devices for each seat
- · Cup holders and tray tables
- Two by two seating on upper and lower levels
- Dedicated space for luggage, prams, bicycles and wheelchairs
- · Accessible toilets
- · Digital screens and announcements
- CCTV and passenger intercoms
- Modern air conditioning

Maintenance facility

A new purpose-built train maintenance facility will be built at Kangy Angy on the Central Coast now that Transport for NSW has made a determination. The new facility will service and maintain the new fleet and will include offices, amenities, staff parking and ancillary buildings.

Feedback received was considered as part of the planning approval process. It was responded to in a Determination Report and Combined Submissions Report which is now available to view at transport.nsw.gov.au/projects/current-projects/new-intercity-fleet-program-maintenance-facility

Construction is expected to start in the coming months. The project team will continue to work with nearby residents and the wider community throughout construction.

Blue Mountains community have their say

In August, a Review of Environmental Factors for modifications along the rail corridor from west of Springwood Station to Lithgow Station was on public display. These modifications are needed to accommodate the new intercity trains on the Blue Mountains line

The public display included information sessions in Springwood, Katoomba and Lithgow for the community to meet the project team, ask questions and provide their feedback. This feedback helps Transport for NSW prepare plans to manage construction impacts.

A Submissions Report is now being prepared and we will let the community know as soon as the report is available to view.

Sydney Growth Trains

The NSW Government is investing more than \$1.5 billion as part of the More Trains, More Services program to boost capacity through hundreds of extra services, better infrastructure and new trains for Sydney. Sydney Growth Trains is the centrepiece of the More Trains, More Services program providing 24 new eight-carrriage, Waratah style suburban trains.

Mortdale Maintenance Centre

The existing maintenance centre at Mortdale in southern Sydney is being modified to allow for the maintenance of our expanding fleets.

Subject to planning approval part of the existing Mortdale Maintenance Centre will be used to service and maintain the new trains.

A Review of Environmental Factors (REF) was prepared to assess the environmental impacts associated with expected changes to operations at the Mortdale facility. The REF was on public display for comment from 13 June to 10 July 2017. The issues raised in written submissions will be addressed in a Determination Report which will be available in the next few months.

Manufacturing of the trains is currently underway with the first trains expected to begin rolling onto the tracks from late 2018.

A new regional train fleet for NSW

On 14 August, Deputy Premier John Barilaro announced the replacement of NSW's entire regional train fleet, including XPTs, Endeavours and XPLORERs, as well as the construction of a new rail maintenance facility in regional NSW.

Subject to planning approval, Dubbo in western NSW was announced as the preferred location for the new facility.

A number of sites alongside the rail network as well as existing rail maintenance facilities were considered for their suitability. All identified locations in regional NSW which had the potential to meet the project's objectives were assessed against key criteria.

Procurement for the new trains also began in August, when expressions of interest were called to design, construct, maintain and finance the new trains and maintenance facility. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to prepare a more detailed tender proposal.

We are looking to award a contract in early 2019 and the first trains are anticipated to come into service in the early 2020s.

Tangara Technology Upgrade Phase 2

The Tangara Technology Upgrade project is improving the 55 Tangara trains' (446 carriages) reliability, availability, safety, and both crew/passenger experience by upgrading current technology and introducing new technology.

This will extend the life of the Tangara fleet by 10 years.

Upgrades are expected to be complete in 2019.
