Temporary access changes on Railway Road

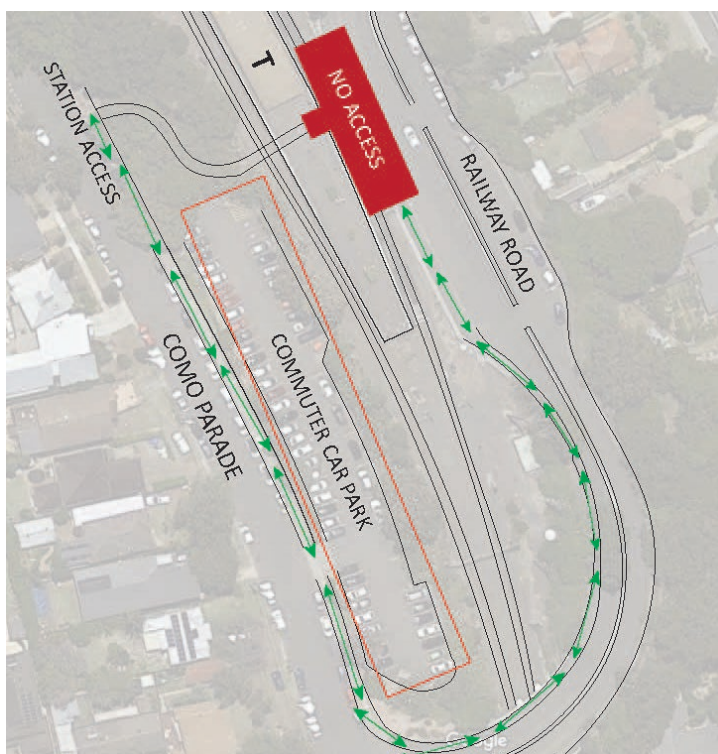
From **Monday 24 August**, Railway Road entry / exit will be closed for approximately 6 weeks to allow construction work for the Como Station Upgrade. Access to and from Como Station will be available via Como Parade only.

The temporary closure is required to ensure the safety of customers and our workers while we complete work for the new lift.

Pedestrian detour

Signage and traffic control staff will be in place to direct pedestrians over the Railway Road Bridge to the station entry on Como Parade. Please see the map below for further detail.

The pedestrian detour is approximately 350m long, so customers approaching from the Railway Road side of the station are advised to allow additional travel time to get to Como Parade.
