

Investigation work at Denistone Station from 25 OctoberOctober 2021

The NSW Government is proposing to improve accessibility at Denistone Station as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure across the state.

Upcoming work

From **7am to 6pm on Monday 25 to Friday 29 October** we will be carrying out geotechnical and utilities investigations on Gordon Crescent near Denistone Station to undertake road core drilling work for geotechnical assessment.

Traffic changes

Temporary lane closures will be in place for approximately two hours per day on Gordon Crescent to support construction vehicles accessing the station safely.

There are no pedestrian access changes to the station entrance. Access for emergency vehicles will remain available at all times.



Weekend work

We will also be on site from **6am to 6pm on Saturday 30 October and Sunday 31 October** to undertake the following work:

- digging potholes to confirm location of utilities
- · surveying to collect information on the work area
- CCTV investigation
- · opening utility pits for inspection.

During the weekend work, public access to Denistone Station will be temporarily closed. Buses will replace trains during this time. Please visit www.transportnsw.info or call 131 500 for up to date information regarding service updates and replacement buses during this time.

How will the work affect you?

The work may be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to lessen the disturbance, including turning off vehicles and equipment when not in use, monitoring noise levels, using nontonal reversing beepers and sound barriers.

Additionally, up to five parking spaces in the commuter car park will be unavailable for the duration of the work. The rest of the carpark will remain open and the exit will be maintained for commuters.

Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist pedestrians and motorists around the area when required.

These works are in line with the current Public Health Orders and a COVID-Safe plan is in place, including the use of face masks and QR codes.
